***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

Officers observed a subject obstructing the roadway. Upon approaching the individual, the officers made verbal contact, but the subject ignored their commands and walked away. The officer then attempted to detain the subject by instructing him to remain at the scene; however, the subject continued to refuse. In response to the subject's noncompliance, the officer displayed his department-issued Taser to gain control of the situation. The subject, upon seeing the Taser, subsequently complied with the officer's commands. The subject was ultimately cited for pedestrian obstruction in the roadway.

Officers were notified of a subject actively cutting utility wires in the area. Upon arrival, officers utilized a drone to locate the subject, who was found hiding in the woods near the scene. Officers approached the subject, issued commands for him to remain in place and show his hands. In order to ensure compliance and mitigate potential risk, one of the officers displayed their department-issued Taser. The subject complied with

the officers' commands, and he was subsequently taken into custody. The subject was charged with felony Criminal Damage to Property.

Officers were notified of a burglary in progress at a local storage facility. Upon arriving at the scene, officers observed the suspects were still present. The officers made contact with the subjects while keeping their department-issued firearms drawn for safety and to ensure compliance. The subjects were taken into custody without incident. The individuals were charged with burglary.

Officers were notified of a theft in progress at a department store. Store employees had attempted to stop the suspect, who dropped the stolen merchandise and fled on foot. Officers arrived on the scene and observed the suspect running. The officers issued multiple commands for the subject to stop, but the suspect continued to flee. One officer closed the distance and gave additional verbal commands while displaying his department-issued Taser to encourage compliance. The subject ultimately complied with the officer's commands and was taken into custody. The individual was charged with felony theft.

Officers responded to a theft at a local store. While enroute, they observed two subjects matching the description provided, crossing the road away from the business. Upon exiting their vehicle, the officer issued verbal commands for the subjects to stop, but a foot chase ensued. One officer was able to catch up to the female suspect, displayed her department-issued Taser, and the suspect ceased fleeing and complied with the officer's commands. She was subsequently taken into custody. The male subject was located by another officer in a nearby backyard. The officer displayed a Taser toward the male subject, and he complied with the officer's commands. Both subjects were charged with resisting arrest and theft. The male subject was also found in possession of an AR-15 style pistol and was charged with unlawful use of a weapon.

Officers responded to a local convenience store regarding an unruly patron. Upon arrival, they encountered a female subject who was inside the store, actively requesting to be taken to jail. The subject began knocking over displays and causing a disturbance. During the interaction, she threatened to take one of the officer's firearms. After a failed attempt to grab the officer's pistol and subsequently falling to the ground, the officers physically carried the subject out of the store. It was determined that the subject was experiencing a mental health crisis. She was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation. No injuries.

Officers responded to a local convenience store for a report of a theft in progress. Upon arrival, they observed a subject running from the store, who was determined to be the suspect in the theft. One officer caught up to the suspect and displayed their department-issued Taser in an attempt to gain compliance. The subject moved to the side of the road but continued to resist the officers' commands. The officers then took the subject to the ground and handcuffed him while he actively resisted. The subject was subsequently charged with resisting arrest, public intoxication, and theft. No injuries.

Officers responded to a local convenience store for a report of an unruly subject refusing to leave the premises. Upon arrival, the officer located the subject in the store's restroom, consuming an unpaid beer. After making several requests for the subject to leave, the officer determined it necessary to arrest the subject for criminal trespass. The subject was handcuffed and escorted to an awaiting patrol vehicle. However, the subject resisted entering the vehicle. Due to the subject's resistance, officers were required to push the subject into the vehicle to complete the transport. The subject was later charged with criminal trespass and obstructing a peace officer. No injuries.
