**\*A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

Officers responded to a report of possible trespassers at a vacant residence known to local authorities. Upon arrival, two individuals were located inside the property. One immediately fled on foot while the other remained at the scene. Officers pursued the fleeing individual, issuing clear verbal commands. During the pursuit, officers drew and displayed their department-issued Tasers as a precautionary measure to ensure compliance. The individual eventually complied with the officers' commands and was taken into custody without incident.

Both individuals were identified as juveniles. After confirming their identities and ensuring there were no outstanding concerns, the juveniles were released into the custody of their parents.

Officers were dispatched to a local hotel in response to a reported domestic battery incident. Upon arrival, they attempted to speak with a male involved in the situation. The individual appeared agitated and refused to cooperate, walking away despite repeated requests to remain with the officers.

Given the escalating behavior and the need to safely manage the situation, officers attempted to detain the individual in handcuffs. The subject resisted by pulling away, prompting one officer to display a department-issued Taser. The show of the device resulted in immediate compliance, and the individual was safely taken into custody without further incident.

Subsequent investigation revealed the individual had an outstanding warrant. He was transported to the appropriate detention facility for further processing.

Officers attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a vehicle for a traffic violation when the driver failed to comply and fled the scene. A vehicle pursuit ensued and ended in a nearby residential neighborhood, where the car eventually came to a stop.

Upon stopping, three of the four occupants exited the vehicle and fled on foot. Officers detained the remaining passenger at gunpoint without incident. A search of the area led to the apprehension of two additional individuals. During these arrests, officers displayed their department-issued Tasers as a precautionary measure to encourage compliance. Both individuals cooperated and were taken into custody safely.

Officers were dispatched to an apartment complex following reports of an individual aggressively kicking entry doors. Upon arrival, they encountered a visibly agitated and disorderly subject who refused to comply with verbal commands and fled on foot.

In an effort to stop the individual, officers deployed a department-issued Taser; however, the attempt was unsuccessful. The subject then attempted to enter a nearby apartment but was intercepted by officers. He was taken to the ground and handcuffed after a brief struggle.

Due to continued violent behavior, the subject was placed in leg restraints to ensure the safety of all parties during transport. He was taken to the police department and subsequently charged with disorderly conduct and resisting arrest.

Officers were dispatched to a local restaurant following reports of a fight in progress. Upon arrival, they quickly determined the incident was a domestic disturbance involving a father and his adult son.

The son appeared visibly intoxicated and refused to comply with officers' verbal commands. Due to his escalating agitation, officers attempted to detain him for safety reasons. The subject resisted, prompting an officer to perform a controlled rear takedown to bring him to the ground. He was then safely handcuffed and taken into custody.

The individual was charged with aggravated domestic battery, resisting arrest, and public intoxication.
