***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

Officers were dispatched to a local bar for a report of a physical disturbance. Upon arrival, they observed an active fist fight in progress. One subject had blood on his face and appeared injured, while the second subject was standing over him in an aggressive stance. Believing the second subject posed an immediate threat of continued violence, an Officer deployed a department-issued Taser, striking the subject and neutralizing the fight. After being tased, the subject fell and struck his head. The first subject continued to display aggressive behavior but was given verbal commands and secured in handcuffs without further incident. Both subjects were removed from the premises. Witnesses confirmed the first subject instigated the fight, was intoxicated, and that the Taser deployment was necessary to prevent further injury. The aggressor was taken into custody and charged with Aggravated Battery.

Officers responded to a local business regarding a report of a male subject sitting in a parked vehicle with a gun in his lap. Upon arrival, the suspect vehicle began to drive away, and Officers attempted an investigative stop based on the report to ensure public safety. The driver refused to stop and took evasive actions, prompting Officers to terminate the attempt due to safety concerns. Shortly after, the suspect vehicle was found to have crashed into an uninvolved vehicle nearby. Officers responded to the crash and observed the suspect flee on foot carrying an AR-style pistol. Officers pursued while giving loud verbal commands for him to stop. The suspect refused to comply, and an Officer deployed a Taser to safely gain control and take him into custody. The firearm was recovered and secured as evidence. The subject was taken into custody for Aggravated Fleeing and Eluding, Obstructing a Peace Officer, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, and Possession of a Controlled Substance.

Officers were dispatched to a residence for a report of a shooting. Upon arrival, the subject indicated that a family member had discharged a firearm. To safely manage the potential threat and maintain control of the scene, Officers displayed their department-issued firearms while giving verbal commands to the potentially armed family member. The involved party complied with all orders, exited the residence, and was secured without incident. It was later learned that after physical domestic violence the firearm was discharged to prevent any further battery.

Officers responded to a report of a suspicious subject trespassing at a residence, described as a white female wearing a pink blanket. While searching the grounds, the subject was located hiding behind a vehicle and holding an object that could not be clearly identified. An Officer drew a department-issued firearm and gave loud verbal commands, to which the subject complied. The subject was taken into custody for Criminal Trespass to Real Property without incident.

Officers responded to a local hotel for a domestic disturbance after staff reported subjects yelling in a room. Upon arrival, a male and female were located inside a room that appeared in disarray, and the female had visible marks on her face. Both subjects were heavily intoxicated and refused to comply with lawful orders to leave the property. The male subject eventually exited the room after repeated warnings, while the female continued to refuse and was placed under arrest for Disorderly Conduct and Resisting a Peace Officer. She resisted while being handcuffed and escorted to the patrol vehicle, requiring minimal physical guidance to ensure compliance. The male subject was also taken into custody for Disorderly Conduct and Resisting a Peace Officer without further incident. Both were transported to the police department for processing.

Officers responded to a residence following a broadcast from another agency regarding a kidnapping suspect with an outstanding felony warrant. Officers established a perimeter and awaited the requesting agency. While waiting, the suspect exited the residence and was contacted by perimeter officers. To safely manage the situation, an Officer displayed a department-issued firearm and issued loud, clear verbal commands. The suspect complied and was taken into custody without incident, searched incident to arrest, and then transferred to the requesting agency for their investigation.

Officers were dispatched to a possible domestic situation involving a firearm. Upon arrival, they established a perimeter around the residence. When the subject exited, Officers displayed department-issued rifles and issued loud verbal commands to ensure the subject did not have a firearm and to maintain control of the scene. The subject complied, was found to be unarmed, and provided a statement regarding the incident.

Officers were dispatched to a possible domestic situation involving a firearm. Upon arrival, they established a perimeter around the residence. An Officer located a subject walking near the rear of the residence and, due to the potential involvement, displayed a department-issued rifle and issued loud verbal commands to lay on the ground. The subject complied and was determined to be uninvolved, then released without incident.
