***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

Officers responded to a local department store for a theft in progress. Officers entered the establishment and observed the suspect pushing a cart of merchandise towards the front doors. The suspect observed the officer and left the cart with the merchandise and began to exit the store. Store employees informed the officer that the subject had committed a theft the day prior as well. Officers attempted to stop the subject, who immediately fled on foot. During the foot chase, the officer deployed probes from their department-issued taser which were ineffective in incapacitating the suspect. The subject was not captured.

Officers responded to a local apartment complex and met with a subject who advised that his girlfriend shattered his windshield. After she damaged his property, she departed on foot. Officers searched for the suspect and located her nearby. Once one of the officers began to handcuff the suspect, the suspect pulled loose, and punched the officer in the face. She was pulled to the ground and handcuffed. Officers later

determined the property damage occurred in an adjoining jurisdiction. The subject was arrested and charged with aggravated battery on a peace officer.

Officers responded to a local business for a subject believed to be panhandling inside the business. In addition, witnesses believed they observed a firearm on the subject's person. Officers made contact with the suspect as he was riding his bike away from the business. Officers conducted an investigative stop and informed the subject he would be temporarily detained due to the report of weapons. The subject refused to be detained and was pulled off of his bicycle to the ground and handcuffed. In addition, officers pulled and displayed their department-issued taser in order to attempt to gain compliance. A cursory pat-down revealed a concealed BB gun. A subsequent search revealed two additional BB guns and methamphetamine in his property. He was charged with methamphetamine possession and resisting a peace officer.

Officers responded to a local business for a report of a subject, seemingly intoxicated, creating a disturbance. Once officers arrived, they located the subject who was informed he would be arrested for public intoxication. The subject refused the officer's orders to place his hands behind his back. The subject was pulled to the ground by one arm and secured in handcuffs. The subject was charged with public intoxication and was banned from the property as requested by the business management.

Officers responded to a local motel for a report of a disturbance. Upon arrival, officers learned from the clerk that a customer refused to keep the noise down in their room. When confronted, the suspect became upset and knocked a sign off of the wall. Officers made contact with the subject who was obviously intoxicated. While officers were speaking to the subject, she shoved her significant other in the chest, causing officers to secure her in handcuffs. She initially resisted, was pulled to the ground and handcuffed. She was charged with domestic battery and disorderly conduct.

Officers responded to a local motel for a report of a domestic disturbance. Once officers arrived, they attempted to separate both parties but were met with resistance. Due to the excited nature of one of the parties, officers decided to detain him in handcuffs during the investigation. As officers attempted to place the subject into handcuffs, he produced a knife. Officers pinned the subject to the railing and the suspect dropped the knife. Multiple officers were required to secure the subject in handcuffs. Neither the suspect nor officers were injured during the incident. The subject was charged with battery and resisting arrest.

Officers responded to a request for mutual aid in Shiloh, Illinois. Shiloh Police Department required assistance in arresting a homicide suspect, out of Cahokia Heights, barricaded in a residence in their jurisdiction. Officers arrived and ordered the suspect out of the house. Due to the nature of the offense and the offender's propensity for violence, officers displayed their department-issued rifle in the direction of the suspect while he was being arrested.
