<sup>\*</sup>A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and improved training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:

A report a subject was starting a fire at the front of a business. Upon contact with the subject, he attempted to flee and continued to do so after being informed he was being detained. The subject threatened the officer with physical harm. The officer gave wrapped his arms around him to attempt to control him. The subject continued to resist and he was wrestled to the ground. Officers complained of lower back pain and the hyperextension of fingers during the struggle. The subject had minor abrasions. The subject was found to be diagnosed with schizophrenia.

Officers responded to an unwanted subject at a hotel. After speaking with the subject, he refused to leave the business and threw coffee onto the supervising officer. The subject was wrestled to the ground and handcuffed.

The subject had minor abrasions to the right wrist, which appeared to be from a previous injury. The officers were not injured. The subject was determined to be diagnosed with schizophrenia.

Contacted a subject with a felony warrant for armed robbery. The subject attempted to flee into the bathroom but was stopped by the officer, who pulled the subject out. The subject fell onto the officer, causing injury. The subject was controlled and taken into custody. No other force used; no injuries to the subject. Subject was determined to suffer from mental health issues.

Three suspects were contacted at a department store for occupying a wanted felony vehicle. All three suspects failed to comply and resisted arrest by running or fighting officers. One subject was wrestled to the ground, falling on top of the officer, causing injury to the officer. The second subject ran away from the officer. The officer effectively deployed his taser and took the second subject into custody. The third subject was taken into custody, at taser point but not tased, after running from the scene. Subjects were found to be in possession of two loaded firearms, a large quantity of controlled substances (heroin) and two felony warrants with no bond. No injuries to the suspects but an officer was injured and continues to be on medical leave.

Officer responded with DCFS for a report of a juvenile possessing a firearm in his home. DCFS attempted to interview the juvenile, who attempted to run from the scene. Officers attempted to contain the juvenile, who subsequently punched the officer in the face. The juvenile was wrestled to the ground and handcuffed. Juvenile is believed to suffer from mental health issues. Officer was injured but no injuries to the juvenile.
