\*A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and improved training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:

Officers responded to a subject yelling obscenities and threatening employees. Officers attempted to arrest the subject for disorderly conduct. The subject fled across 159, where he was caught. During the handcuffing process, the subject attempted to flee, which required the officer to escort the subject to the ground to gain control. A light scuff to the suspect's left wrist was sustained.

The officer observed a subject walking down the middle of the roadway on an unilluminated portion of Old Lincoln Trail. Upon contacting the suspect, she observed he was under the influence of an unknown substance. She attempted to detain him, but he continued to walk away. The officer escorted the subject to the ground and secured him in handcuffs. No injuries were sustained.

Officers contacted the suspect for suspicion of DUI and conducted testing. During the testing, the suspect walked away from the officers and refused commands to return. Officers attempted to detain the subject, who resisted arrest. During the incident, the suspect was tasered. He was handcuffed and transported to the police department. While in secure detention, he was again non-compliant. He stood up from the processing desk and was agitated. The officer attempted to place him back in handcuffs, and he again resisted detention. The subject was tasered a second time due to his level of resistance. No significant injuries were sustained, only probe injuries that did not require medical attention.

Officers, while responding to a burglar alarm at a business near the Metrolink, noticed a suspect lingering around. Believing the suspect was involved in a burglary, he made contact and ordered the subject to stop while holding him at gun point. The subject refused to remove his hands from his pocket and subsequently ran away from the officer. The subject was apprehended. It was determined the business was burglarized and the suspect was arrested for the said offense.

Officer responded to a report of a subject attempted to kick in the front door of a residence. Upon arrival, officer heard an active disturbance at the front door. He unholstered his weapon and identified the subject was matching the description provided by dispatch. Officers gave verbal commands and the subject complied. He was subsequently charged with criminal trespass to residence (felony) as he had a familial connection with the occupants of the residence.

Officers observed a U-haul truck that was reported stolen. Officers drew their firearms and commanded the subjects from the vehicle. Both occupants exited the vehicle without incident and were taken into custody.

Subject called 911 for an unknown emergency. Officers arrived and attempted to speak to the caller who appeared to be suffering from a mental health episode. The subject picked up a plastic outdoor cigarette receptacle. The initial responding officer removed his taser and provided the subject verbal commands to put the receptacle down. The suspect complied and was handcuffed. The suspect became agitated after being handcuffed and threw himself backwards toward the officer who escorted him to the ground. No injuries to the suspect or the officer was sustained.

Officers conducted a vehicle stop on a subject acting suspiciously. A K9 sniff of the vehicle alerted to the presence of narcotics. While the vehicle was being searched, officers located suspected controlled substance and evidence of a firearm. While attempting to secure the subject in handcuffs he fled on foot. The pursuing officer pulled his taser and pointed it at the suspect but did not deploy probes after consideration of its effectiveness. A ghost gun was located inside of the vehicle.
