***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and improved training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

An officer was searching for a suspect in an aggravated battery. When entering the area, the officer noticed a subject attempting to pull another out of the driver's seat of a car in the parking lot of the gas station. He exited and drew his department-issued firearm while pointing at the subject, seemingly stealing the vehicle. The suspect sped off the parking lot regardless of the verbal commands. The suspect was later taken into custody after crashing the vehicle at 50 and Weinel. After the crash, the suspect fled on foot. Through accounts of suspicious activity by residents, officers closed in on the subject in a residential garage on Fairview Drive. Two officers entered the garage, one with his department-issued firearm unholstered and the other with his department-issued taser unholstered, and observed the subject laying in the corner. He was provided verbal commands and subsequently complied with officer instructions. He was taken into custody without incident.

An officer located a subject driving a 4-wheeler on Lincoln Trail. The subject fled from the officer onto Voss Drive and turned the 4-wheeler on its side. The officer removed his duty-issued weapon and positioned it at the low ready while giving the suspect commands. The subject was compliant and was secured in handcuffs without incident.

Officers received a license plate reader notification that a vehicle passing through town was wanted for armed robbery out of St. Louis City. An officer located the vehicle and initiated a high-risk vehicle stop. Three more officers were on the scene to assist with the traffic stop. All officers had their department-issued firearms unholstered and pointed toward the vehicle. The suspect was compliant with officer’s verbal commands and subsequently taken into custody.
