***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

An officer responded to a subject slumped behind the wheel in the St. Louis Bread Company parking lot. After contacting the subject, he was determined to have an active warrant. The officer instructed the subject to exit the vehicle, but the subject seemed to be stalling and reaching toward the vehicle's passenger side. Officers physically grabbed the suspect as he resisted being pulled from the vehicle. The initial contact officer removed his Taser from the holster and warned the subject, but did not deploy, who subsequently complied. A search of the passenger side area of the vehicle revealed an illegally possessed "ghost" gun.

Officers responded to Moody Park after it was reported that a male was taking photographs of other occupants of the park's restroom. Officers found the subject as he was running through the park. He refused the officer's commands to stop which caused them to detain him physically. The suspect, a known registered sex offender, resisted being handcuffed and was taken to the ground to maintain control. The subject was subsequently handcuffed and transported.

An officer responded to a theft report from Schnucks, where the subject fled towards St. Clair Square. The officer observed the subject outside of Dillard’s. The subject subsequently ran inside Dillard’s with the officer pursuing him. The officer displayed, but did not deploy, his taser toward the suspect, and the subject complied with his directions to get on the ground. The suspect was taken into custody.

Officers responded to a fight in progress at Super 8 Motel. Subjects occupying a Penske Box truck in the Super 8 parking lot displayed a pistol during the altercation. With weapons drawn and positioned at the low ready, officers conducted a high-risk vehicle stop based on the indication of weapons. All occupants of the vehicle were taken into custody. Two loaded firearms were recovered from the vehicle.

Officers assisted O’Fallon Police Officers waiting for a suspect to return to their vehicle in the CSL Plasma parking lot. The vehicle was wanted by St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department for a shooting a few days prior. The suspect returned to the vehicle, and a high-risk vehicle stop was conducted. The suspect exited the vehicle and refused to comply with commands by the officers. The subject ran west and began shooting at the officers on the scene. An FHPD officer returned fire while pursuing the suspect. Another FHPD officer drew his firearm and began to pursue the suspect. The suspect ultimately turned his gun on himself, shooting himself in the head.
