***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

Officer contacted a known fugitive who rented a room at the French Village Motel. Upon doing so, the Officer informed the subject he was under arrest. The subject began to back up toward the bathroom of the cabin. One Officer removed his duty-issued Taser from the holster and displayed it to the suspect. The Officer gave the subject loud verbal commands, and the subject ultimately became compliant. The Taser was not activated.

Officers arrested a subject for public intoxication at the Winchester Place Apartments. During the booking process, the subject refused to follow instructions to enter the booking room. The Officer attempted to turn the subject in the correct direction. Upon doing so, the subject turned toward the Officer and raised his hand in a threatening manner. The Officer pushed the subject away. The subject fell to the ground, hitting his head on the door. No injuries were sustained and no further aggression by the subject.

An Officer conducted a traffic stop and observed the handle of a handgun beneath the driver's seat. The Officer removed their duty firearm from the holster and displayed it until cover Officers arrived and the driver and the firearm were secured. It was discovered that the firearm was being transported illegally.

Officers responded to Chestnut Mental Health to assist staff with an involuntary admission of a resident for mental health evaluation. The subject refused to go to the hospital. Officers attempted to detain the subject for transport, but the subject resisted. The subject had to be held on the ground until EMS personnel could sedate him. Despite five Officers being there other assistance was called in order to reduce any injuries to the subject.

Officers responded to a report of a retail theft from a department store that had just occurred. The suspect was observed walking in front of Burlington Coat Factory with a shopping cart of merchandise. The first arriving Officer attempted to place the subject in handcuffs. The subject pulled away and was taken to the ground by the Officer using hand controls. A second Officer arrived on scene and assisted by holding the subject on the ground. While doing so the suspect repeatedly struck his own head on the ground. As a result, he was placed in a patrol vehicle where he struck his head on the prisoner partition numerous times. The subject was evaluated for potential head injuries at Belleville Memorial Hospital and was transported to the county jail pending felony warrants. ***Body Cameras and our new in car camera system showed the subject banging his head on the ground and inside the back of the squad car. It shows Officer trying to stop him several times.
